Membership & Services

- All Counties affiliated including Powys/Aberystwyth for the first time.
- Received confirmation from CGCW – awarded £18,500 over 2 years, for attendance for 4 players and a coach to 2 world open doubles events in Australia 2017 & 2017 and training pairs support. Events to be used towards qualification.
- Coming to the end of the 2015/2016 squash season draws to a close - Adult Team Squash continues to be the backbone of club squash and credit must go to the 400 volunteers who are the “HEART BEAT” in the Counties and Clubs of Wales. Also a huge thanks must go to League Manager Mike Howe for the endless hours of hard work organising the South Wales Leagues and assisting the County League organisers from North, South and West Wales. League Squash in Wales now has 170 teams playing weekly with the VOLUNTEER Captains inputting the results on the website.
- Racket ball – launch continues – significantly raised awareness with mini 1 day exhibitions in many South, Mid and West clubs and information placed on the web site.
- Held the 2nd Racketball National championships in Swansea.
- WSRB- Delivered squash/mini squash experience in 53 schools/leisure centres to 3,991 pupils.
- Continue promoting “you know it makes sense” National Campaign for all juniors must wear gogglesDrive promote leagues – all events and WSRB social networking sites.
- WSRB Post Standards review feedback, see separate feedback from CPSU.
- Cardiff LA stance on their Active card has caused discontent in Fairwater and Llanishen clubs. Waiting for the membership review in May 2016.
- Ladies activity initiative - WSRB have arranged for 2 coaches to train ladies squads – Abby Hicks will be the coach in the East and Sian Johnson in the West. 20 ladies have signed up. South Glam and Welsh closed have shown an increase in ladies entries.
- Rhiwbina Squash Club -Congratulations to the continued work carried out by Bob Perry, Richard Plenty and all the coaches who take part in the disability squash evenings. The club has been awarded the silver insport plaque in recognition of this work and club of the month circulated across the whole of Wales.

Partnership working:

- **Cardiff** - meetings had with Sport Cardiff, North Sport Cardiff team, and co-ordinated meeting with Dev Team and disability sport wales. Rhiwbina squash club have been awarded the DSW in sport certificate. Looking forward to meeting with Badminton for a racketlon. Currently delivering Mini squash to a Scouts group in Canton.
- **Carmarthenshire** – attended a meeting with Carmarthen CC Sport Development Officers on behalf of WSRB. Currently agreeing new initiatives with their officers in Carmarthen, St Clears and Llanelli squash clubs.
- **Pembrokeshire** - area crosses over to Carmarthen and Caerdygon .Held a Leaders award., school visits with exit routes into Clubs - 11 new level 1 coach applications in to attend the course at the Meads July most working within LA Leisure centres this will be the biggest progress in Pembrokeshire as most applicants are from clubs not currently coaching. , WSRB provided mini squash for 'Let's Get Active' at Milford Haven Leisure Centre aims to improve the number of people with a learning disability choosing to lead an active lifestyle and take part in sport and physical activity. Designed for people with a learning disability, friends and family, carers and support workers, it provides opportunities to become physical active whilst trying a number of different sporting and physical activities.
- **Blaenau Gwent** – Held a Leaders award, school visits with exit routes into Clubs. New weekend Junior coaching paid for by LA, and courts also covered. Two 5x60 after-schools racketball clubs have been established. £1500 community chest success.
- **Newport** – Meetings had with LA, extensive school taster squash program established with clear exit route into Newport Junior Coaching (6 school visits this term). Sessions advertised by LA. £1500 community chest success. Squash festival planned after school programme.
- **Bridgend – Maesteg** received £1,500 Community chest. School program established at Maesteg and Bridgend, with support from sport development officers in attendance at schools, providing exit routes to junior coaching. Bridgend College , providing weekly Racketball sessions/coaching - The college has a residential facility which offers 24 hour care and curriculum provision for the young people to give them the social and educational opportunities they require as they progress to adulthood.
- **Vale of Glam LA** - 5x60 schools Cowbridge, support Barry /Vale schools project and a Vale festival in Cowbridge and Barry, paid for LA for coach and court fees.
- **Powys LA** - Central forum. After school clubs in Llanidloes, Newtown and new after school club in Brecon and Llanidloes. Secured £2,000 from sport Powys. Coach Education & Young Leaders @ Newtown but Outreach to support other Powys activities.
 - Central Development Squads & Area Performance Squads; all leading into WSRB Player Pathways (Talent ID, Academy & National Squads)
 - FE initiatives, partnership working with NPTC @ Newtown. Taster Sessions & follow up.
 - Dragon Sports, Girl Guides & 5X60 events across Powys; Newtown, Abermule, Llandrindod Wells, Brecon, Bro Dyfi, Llanfyllin, Llanidloes. This provides 100's of youngsters with an opportunity to “try” Squash & Racketball, through the use of “Mini Squash” activities in a wide range of settings.
 - Girls Only Initiatives; Specialist programmes & activities at Newtown & Llanfyllin have proved to be hugely successful and as a result we have large numbers of girls and young women coming through the system and working with female coaches. They have had success not just within Wales, but also out of County in Shropshire & North Wales.
 - National Success. Players from Powys access the player pathway at all levels through to selection.
- **Aberystwyth** on board with juniors in the pathway (Academy and National squads) – Adult event Oct supported by WSRB. Plan to set a meeting with Ceredigion to discuss a partnership. Delivered a UKCC Level 1 and level 2 coaching courses. A new junior section has been formed.
- **Merthyr** – 7 school visits, ‘racket rally’ sessions established, courts paid for and coaches paid for by LA.
- **Caerphilly** – Leaders course delivered, school visits co-ordinated through local council, clear exit route to junior coaching at Caerphilly



- **Wrexham** - Wrexham Brymbo application for 3rd court funding to Sport Wales. Waiting for the builder estimates.
- **Torfaen** – meetings had with Dev Team, Junior coaching begun at Pontypool ALC, courts paid for by council, kids recruited through young leaders scheme linked to sports council.
- **Swansea**, Organised an orange ball event at Swansea LT&SRC - 23 players attended. Met with Swansea Sport development Officers, piloting an after school club with Bishop Gore Secondary School.
- Visited Knelston school and Llanrhidian School the pupils were invited for free introductory sessions in Scurlage Sports Club.
- **Conwy**, Linked with Conwy sport development for a rural schools programme, exit routes into Llanwrst LC. Submitted a d restore synergy across North Wales including Le Sport. Due to meet with SW to discuss where the plan fits into the WSRB strategy.
- **Gwynedd** - Schools visited with mini squash, 8 primary schools in Llanwrst , 3 primary schools at Bethesda and 4 schools at Caernarfon. Secondary schools at Penygroes, Caernarfon, tywyn , Pwllheli and Bethesda running a 5x60 squash programme weekly during term time. Meeting with Bangor Uni re scholarship programme.
- **RCT** – Primary school programme ,10 schools. 4 skills days . Exit routes , Llantrisant,Aberdare , we now have weekly junior coaching in Aberdare, Lantrisant and Rhondda.

- 2015/2016 - season has 1 or 2 matches left to play in all regions of Wales.
- One player behaviour complaint – dealt with as per the WSRB complaints procedure. 1 player banned for 2 weeks and 1 player given 2 points for a conduct warning.
- MW attended all County AGMs where possible and provided score pads and score cards, advice and newsletters.
- Both Adult and Junior rankings updated regularly.
- Produced and distributed 2015/2016 South Wales League rule books. – League AGM June 2016
- League squash in Wales has 170 teams playing weekly with the Captains inputting the results on the website portal which is updated every day. We continue to receive excellent feedback for the result service.
- Currently exploring a new result service – I will keep you informed.

Player Pathway 2015/2016:

The player pathway is predominantly funded by Wales Squash and Racketball in order that juniors from all regions in Wales receive WSRB pathway specialised coaching on a regular basis both regionally and nationally:-

- **Elite Cymru** – World class coaching and competition programme for 4 Welsh players.
- **Individual 1-2-1** coaching from the HPC's for U13/U15/U17/U19 Elite and emerging Elite players
- **European Tournament Support** – HPC's will be funded to attend, coach and provide instant feedback to all Welsh players competing at the cutting edge of competition in selected European Super Series and English Silver tournaments
- **National Squads – U17/19 & U15** National Squads - 4 squads of 2 Days (48hrs coaching). **U13** National squads - 2 squads of 2 days and 4 1 day regional squads. U11 national – 6X 1Day regional squads.
- **Academy Squads** – regionalised Academy coaching for 24hrs for players aged U11 to U19
- **Academy Training Night** – up to 42 weeks of regional training night sessions offered to academy players(Player Contribution required)
- **Transition programme** – transition players (Junior to Senior) players will be invited to attend selected BPSA tournaments with coaching provided by the Senior Player High Performance Coach at the event
- **Area Coaching Squads** – School term weekly localised coaching (Player contribution required).
- **Regional Talent ID Squad** – 11 and under mixed talent ID coaching programme with boys and girls receiving over 30hrs of coaching culminating in a Fun Series over 2 days
- **Strength and Conditioning Coach** – Access to Strength & Conditioning Coach -in concert with the WSRB HPCs. .

Safeguarding & Welfare

- A key part of the Framework process is for WSRB to undertake post standards review annually , this will help establish an informed view of our current safeguarding position and progress. This assessment will then inform and shape of our safeguarding implementation or action plan to promote, develop and embed safeguarding practice.

Finance

The accounts for April 2015 – March 2016 have now been completed and are attached .

The profit made for the 12 months was £15670.

The accountants fee from Broomfield Alexander was £1500 , a reduction of £510 from last years charge.

The main reason why the budgeted profit of £17333 was not met , is because accruals were put through at the end of the year to cover the cost to be incurred for the Child Protection Policy Review.

Work Undertaken

1. I review the debtors once a month and chase outstanding , the balance as at 31/3/16 was £9616.61
2. The purchase ledger as at 31/3/16 was £11,339.54
- 3 .A Talent Support spreadsheet is now prepared and circulated to the HPC's , on a monthly basis. This helps them keep a track of what each of their players have spent.
4. WSRB are now required by law to provide employees with a pension. Our staging date was June 1st 2016. The pension provider is Scottish Widows (as advised by Sport Wales).

Future

Funding from Sport Wales for 16/17 has been cut by 5% , which equates to £4020

The impact of this for WSRB , is that we have to fund the reduction from WSRB profits.

WSRB currently have 12 players on the PSA world tour which is the most ever.

Tesni Evans reached the semi final of the British nationals in February 2016

Joel Makin reached the quarter finals of the British nationals in February 2016 beating Declan James world ranked 42 on the way.

WSRB have achieved funding to send 4 players to the World doubles event in Darwin in preparation for the 2018 Commonwealth Games. The players are Tesni, Deon, Peter and Joel.

WSRB have also achieved funding to send a ladies team to the World Team Championships in November. Our target is a top 8 finish.

The ladies team have been seeded 4 at the upcoming European Team Championships to be held in May.

2016/17 Look forward

This season should be an exciting time for both the players and myself as WSRB have agreed to alter their approach in terms of our performance plan. The new plan is geared around archiving excellence with many strict targets in place. It allows more contact time with the players to help improve them. Video analysis will also be used more regular to give our players extra data.

Brief summary of the plan.

- 1) 8 days per month with all the funded and transitional players.
- 2) Vo2 Max testing 3 times a year for all funded players with training programmes to follow.
- 3) Coach to travel to selected PSA world ranking events with the players.
- 4) One to one sessions with the players in addition to the above.

1) Highest number of senior professional players ever playing on the PSA World Tour (12)

Peter Creed, Joel Makin, Emyr Evans, Dave Haley, Owain Taylor, Tesni Evans, Deon Saffery, Elin Harlow, Nia Davies, Jenny Haley, Hannah Williams, Lowri Roberts.

2) Elite Cymru players Tesni, Deon, Peter, Joel

Tesni has achieved her highest world ranking to date of 25. Deon is currently ranked 48. Peter is currently ranked 73. Joel has broken into the top 100 for the first time at number 96.

3) Our 2 target players Emyr Evans and Owain Taylor have risen to 198 and 275 respectively in the rankings after starting out on the World Tour.

4) We are currently using performance analysis with our funded players in partnership with Cardiff Met. We are filming squad sessions, 1-1 sessions along with the players matches at events. Data is then fed back to myself as HPC which is then discussed with the player individually and a forward plan is then made for the player to work on.

5) We have met with the Commonwealth Games Council regarding the 2018 Games and the news has been very positive. Providing qualification criteria is met we could be looking at taking 4 players and a coach. We have also applied for funding from the CGC to help us carry out our doubles preparation which includes the World Doubles in Australia in 2016 and 2017. As soon as this is confirmed with the amount we will release the preparation plan in the lead up to the games with squads, test matches and events.

6) Domestically we have held the North Wales senior open along with the National Championships. We also have the Coors Newport Open along with a new event (Grand Prix) All these events are monrad which gives us plenty of head to head results to aid selection for national representation.

7) Our players currently receive 5 x 3 day Squads, 12 x 1 day Target squads, 10x 2 hour training nights, 1-1 sessions. Individual strength and conditioning programme, performance analysis data and feed back while at certain events.

8) We have also applied for funding to take the ladies team to the World Team Championships in Paris in November. I feel this is important as the ladies have proved over the last few years their performances are consistent and of a high standard. 5th in Europe and 9th in the World.

9) Took a couple of transition players to the British Open under 23 event. Joel Makin was a noticeable success in reaching the final. Very good footage and data from the performance analysis on the other players to put forward plans in place for them as it showed up they are still a little way off although to be fair the ages of our players were very young and many of them have another 2-3 years in that age group.
